We have reviewed the proposed amendment to the County Development Plan 2023-2029 as issued on the 28<sup>th</sup> of November 2022.

We note that the zoning is largely to remain unchanged, however we note your acknowledgement of the needs of the Poor Clare Sisters.

TS 4- Friars Walk Including: OP12 Francis Street and the Causeway

This Friar's Walk Transformational Site (TS4) seeks to substantially intensify, a strategic underutilised town centre land bank site located along Francis Street as well as the surrounding area along with A key objective of the site is to support supporting the delivery of car parking and a public plaza. A multi-storey car park would provide for travel to the Town Centre, alongside a new bus shelter to promote and provide for public transport infrastructure. A proposed new mixed use district would reinforce a connection to Glor and the new County Library, while also delivering high quality housing of a typology that will respond to the needs of the Town in the future.

New residential development will provide an urban edge to the junction, while a multistorey car park and bus shelter would provide for increased public transport usage, helping Ennis to become a more sustainable community.

Any development within the Friars Walk Transformational Site must have regard to the location of The Poor Clare Monastery which has been an integral part of the Ennis Town community since 1958. Any development within the Transformational Site must respect the proximity of the monastery and the use of the grounds within that monastery in supporting The Poor Clare orders' monastic way of life.

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In this regard we would again put forward our argumentation for privacy from overlooking the gardens of the Poor Clare Sisters. Privacy in the contemplative garden is paramount for the contemplative work.

We also request that you remove the Poor Clares sisters monastery and lands from the Friar's Walk Transformation Site TS4.
