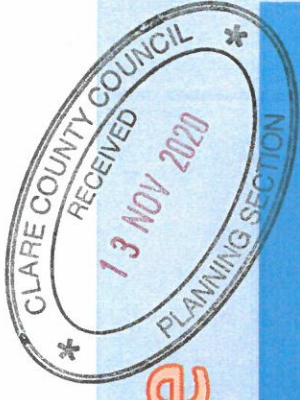

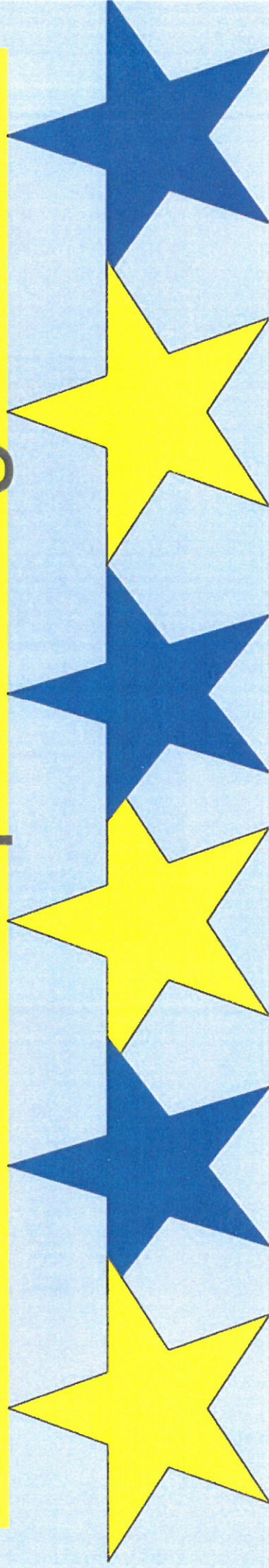

Mullagh

Mullagh is a village in County Clare, Ireland. The village of mullagh is in the centre of the parish of kilmurry Ibrickane. Mullach is mullagh in Irish which means "hill" or "mound"



Our school

Our school was built in 1846.

In 1882 a second schoolroom was built this portion of the school was for female students. In 1960 the school was condemned, the school was too old and it was not fit for use. In the 1970's the school was renovated. In 2004 land was perched and prefabs were installed. In 2007/2008 an extension was built on to the main school, two new classrooms and an two offices were built.



St. Mary's Church Mullagh

St. Marys church mullagh was built in 1819. A tower and spire projected but when the building was partially completed the "Bigwind" 6th of January 1839 knocked a large part of it. It was then completed without a tower or spire and instead a porch was added.



Our Local Area

We looked at the facilities and services in our local area. From the list, we have a very small shop that has a small variety of supplies. We have a sports field that has a running track and changing rooms. We also have a community hall.

Culture and History

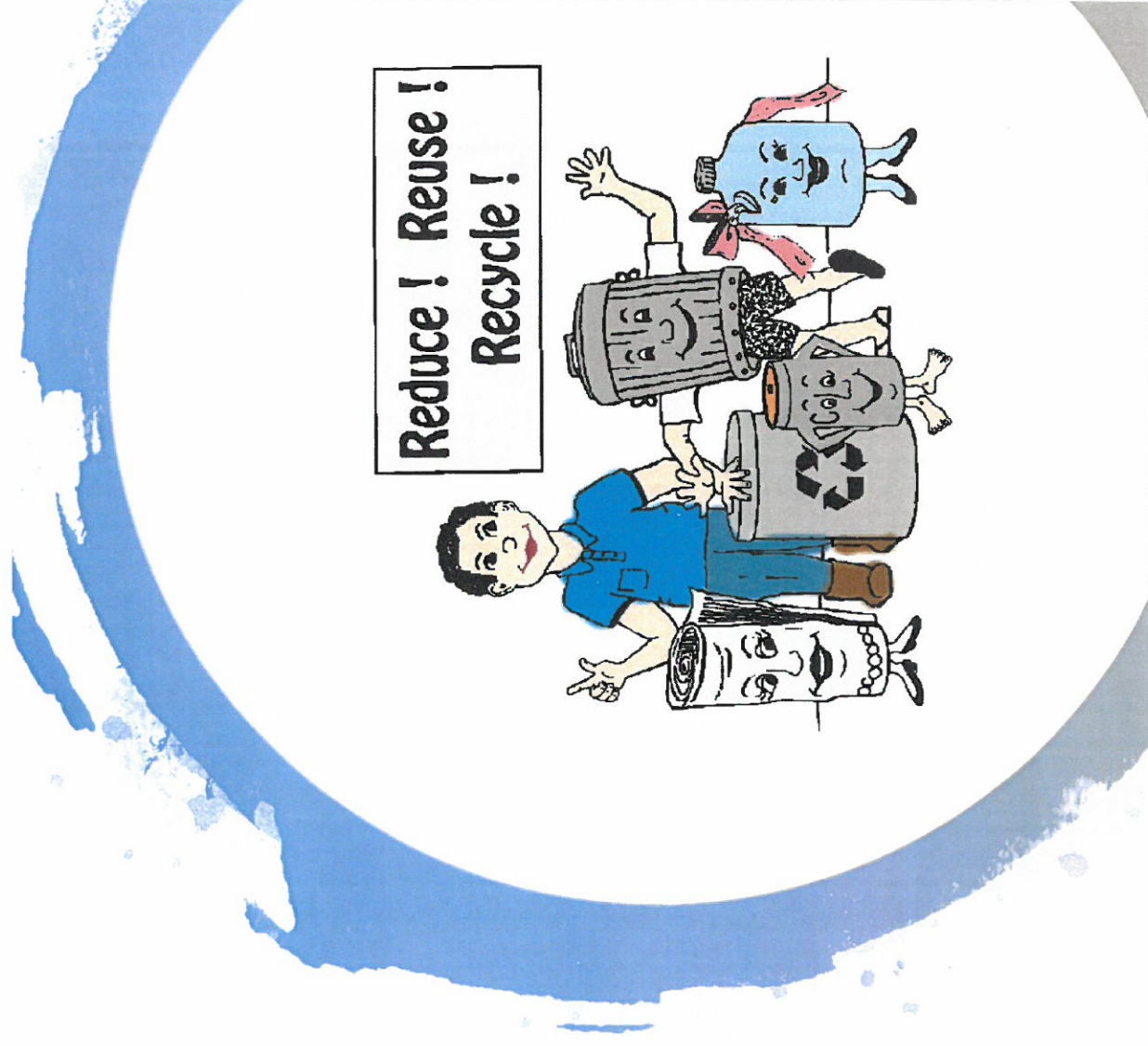

We decided that a new road to the graveyard would be a great addition to the area. Some of our grandparents have family members buried there and when we spoke to them, they said they could not access the burial ground. We also thought it would be cool if an information board was erected at the site, with the names of those buried there.



Environment and Climate Change

We recycle at home and at school to help protect our environment. We use the bottle banks down the road too. Some of us have composters at home that we use to make our own compost.

We do think there is a need for some clothes recycling banks in our area and a need for bins in the village.
